
NOTES FROM THE FIELD

ARTIST RON MINEO TEACHES MT. VERNON TEENS

Through a federal grant, ArtsWestchester, and the Mount Vernon School District, are helping 21 arts teachers learn, acquire and utilize creative skills and innovative teaching strategies for teaching core curricula more effectively. Art Westchester Roster artists are providing professional development to help the art teachers integrate the science, math and ELA curricula into the art classroom. The program also offers experiences for the art teachers and students to learn a variety of exciting media and artistic processes. This semester, art teacher, Ellen Hanney of Nelson Mandela High School is working

with ArtsWestchester Roster Artist Ron Mineo. For six weeks, Mineo, a sculptor, potter and mixed media artist, will be conducting a residency with Ms. Hanney's 9th-12th grade classes in the medium of ceramics. Approximately 30 students are linking art to math and science by learning about anatomy, scale, measuring and human expression and experimenting with the various techniques of ceramics. Ms. Hanney will continue the program later in the spring with artist Jeffrey Schrier creating a recyclable art installation at the school with recycled plastic bottles.



NEWS IN BRIEF

Cultural Post at White House (by Robin Pogrebin for the New York Times, March 13, 2009; compiled by Patrick Healy) President Barack Obama has established a staff position in the White House to oversee arts and culture in the Office of Public Liaison and Intergovernmental Affairs under Valerie Jarrett, a senior adviser, a White House official confirmed. Kareem Dale, a lawyer who last month was named special assistant to the president for disability policy, will hold the new position. Mr. Dale, who is partly blind, previously served as national disability director for the Obama campaign. He also served on the arts policy committee and the disability policy committee for Mr. Obama when he was a senator from Illinois. William "Bill" Ivey, who served as the administration's transition-team leader for the arts and humanities, said he was encouraged by the appointment and would meet with Mr. Dale next week. "It's a big step forward in terms of connecting cultural and government with mainstream administration policy," Mr. Ivey said in an interview on Friday. The White House declined to describe the position in detail, since Mr. Dale's appointment has yet to be formally announced. Mr. Ivey, a former chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, said he expected that

the job would mainly involve coordinating the activities of the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Institute of Museum and Library Services "in relation to White House objectives." Although there have been staff members assigned to culture under past presidents, they usually served in the first lady's office, Mr. Ivey said.

Jon Yanofsky, Executive Director of Paramount Center for the Arts in Peekskill, NY since June 2003, has formally announced he will be stepping down to accept the position of Director of Marketing at Jazz at Lincoln Center in New York City, effective May 2, 2009.
